

FIRS Registered Testing Pool

Athletes selected into the FIRS registered testing pool (RTP) have been forwarded an ADAMS account via their National Federation.

ADAMS is a web based Antidoping administrative system operated by the World Anti-doping Agency (WADA). Available languages are English, French, Spanish, German, Spanish, Arabic and Japanese. ADAMS user guides can be downloaded from the WADA web site www.wada-ama.org.

Athletes included in the RTP and are obliged to do the following

- Submit whereabouts information to ADAMS on a quarterly basis before the 1st January, 1st April, 1st July, 1st October. The system will send a reminder 14 days before submission is due.
- Each entry into ADAMS must be at least one (1) hour long
- Times cannot overlap. This does not apply to daily residence and mailing address which don't have a time limit
- Nominate one hour per day between 6.00am and 11.00pm when they can guarantee to be contacted for testing
- Must submit location descriptors (address) for daily residence, mailing address, training venue, competition venues.
- Each day must have a daily residence notified
- Athletes **MUST** update information immediately if circumstances change
- Whereabouts can be notified in hard copy format. Forms can be downloaded from the FIRS web page www.rollersports.org. Hard copy is much harder to update and its use is discouraged.

Submit by clicking the submit button. The system will not accept incomplete entries.

Athletes can modify whereabouts information at any time by changing the information and clicking the resubmit button.

Modifications can also be notified by SMS

Failure to submit and update whereabouts information as required may result in a filing failure or missed test being recorded against you. Any combination of three (3) missed tests or filing failures in eighteen months will result in a one (1) to two (2) year sanction and period of ineligibility.
